PRESIDENT'S CORNER – Pastor Jonathan Edwards

Greetings dear brothers and sisters in Christ!

I am writing today with a sad heart because we weren't able to gather together for worship, fellowship, encouragement, and teaching at this year's National Conference. I trust God that this was His will for our fellowship at this time, knowing that His plans and purposes are greater than ours, and that "even though a man makes plans, the Lord directs his steps" (Prov. 16:9).

Our present circumstances due to the Covid-19 shutdown and subsequent stay-at-home orders have brought to the forefront the importance of discipling relationships. The first relationship affected was the gathering of the saints for worship at the local church level. Many people have struggled because they haven't been able to attend church. Our struggle reveals a truth that isn't always obvious under "normal" circumstances: that the foundation for discipleship in the present age is the local church. Though we can find hundreds of hours of great theological teaching and encouragement online, we can't replace the personal fellowship that happens when believers gather together for worship – that which the New Testament calls "koinonia." As shutdowns end and the local church gathers to meet again, may we be especially thankful and grateful for the discipling that occurs at our weekly meetings.

Secondly, we ought to learn from the shutdown that one-on-one or small group discipling is a critical component of the command to "Make Disciples" (Matt. 28:19-20). Many states allowed gatherings of 10 or fewer, which would enable one-on-one or small groups to meet. While the gathering of the local church on a weekly basis helps to train us theologically and fulfill the commands of Christ, small groups can help believers bear each other's burdens. Some of these are too difficult (i.e. embarrassing or painful) to share in a larger setting, or there may not even be an opportunity to share. Smaller groups also help bring accountability to our lives and cultivate trust between brothers and sisters in Christ. May we have a renewed dedication for small group and one-on-one discipleship.

In granting us another year to examine the theme "Make Disciples," I hope that as a Fellowship of churches we will work hard at disciple-making during our weekly gatherings. I also hope that we will work to cultivate small group and one-on-one relationships. In my opinion, one of the most significant aspects of Jesus' training of the twelve disciples was the time He invested in them "outside" of formal teaching – He lived life with them, and they saw from His example what godly living should be. May we be willing to open ourselves up to our fellow brothers and sisters, inviting them to spend time with us. May we invest in them and show, by example, what it means to follow Christ.

VANDALIA GRACE BRETHREN CHURCH – ENGLEWOOD, OHIO

On June 14, 2020 our dear brother James Belton, passed from this life into the presence of the Lord. Though now absent from our lives and from his mortal body he is present with the Lord. He was 77 years old.

James Olan Belton Jr. was born in Syracuse, New York, March 7, 1943. He graduated from High School in 1961, and went into the United States Air Force the following year. While stationed in Pforzheim, Germany he came to know the Lord Jesus as his Savior. By 1966 he had finished up his military commitment and returned to the US where he worked briefly for Siemens of America before returning to Germany to work for the United States government. It was there he met his wife Sibylle whom he married in the fall of 1967. Their daughter, Sabine was born the following year. From 1969 to 1970 James worked for the United States Government in Brindisi, Italy and then moved back to Germany where he worked for WANG Computers, first in Düsseldorf, then in Frankfurt.

While attending an English speaking Southern Baptist church in Walldorf, the pastor and a deacon went to their home. Though this pastor had never done such a thing before, he felt that he had to tell James that God wanted him in the ministry. Moving back to the States in 1977, James attended the Empire Baptist Seminary from which he graduated with a B.D. Degree in 1980. He wanted to go back to Germany but his pastor felt that he should have some pastoral experience in the States first. He took the pastorate of the Osceola Baptist Church in Osceola, New York where he ministered for four years. While there they met the Dr. and Mrs. Whitcomb who had a great influence upon their lives. They became dear friends and Dr. Whitcomb encouraged James to go to Grace Seminary. In 1987 James graduated from Grace Theological Seminary with the M.Div. degree. Sibylle graduated

the same year from Grace College, with a BA, and Sabine from Warsaw High School. That same year they entered missionary service with Grace Brethren Foreign Missions and began a church planting ministry with the Jim Fredericks family in Calw, Germany. Starting in 1989 James began a new ministry in Blumberg, Germany, a town that had only one believer when they began the work there. At that time they joined the Conservative Grace Brethren Churches International. In 2000 the Beltons moved to Dresden, in the old East Germany and started a new church there. In 2005 they returned to the U. S. where they have ministered in the Vandalia Grace Brethren with pastor Everett Caes.

Until his death, James had continued contact with all three churches they started in Germany. Sibylle even now continues this ministry.

REVITALIZE VERMONT — Pastor Bryan Maley, Evangelist - Irasburg GBC and Lamoille Valley GBC

"Is anything too hard for the Lord?" Genesis 18:14

Even with COVID being on the rise, the church marches on!! COVID has slowed things down a bunch in Vermont, giving more time for Bryan to be with family, but also more opportunities to be in contact with those whom he is discipling. He reports many victories and some set backs.

Pastor Bryan will not be going church to church this summer, presenting the work, giving a live personal update, seeking prayer and financial support as he would normally plan on doing after conference. That is a prayer concern. The real burden on his heart is to bring discipleship to our churches. He has personally seen the effects and the fruit of making disciples. He has discovered that discipling isn't hard to do, but it does require commitment. (This is not surprising!)

Bryan has discovered spending time with people, taking an interest in their everyday life: working a job, doing a project, serving and doing ministry, fishing, hunting, gardening, working on a car. Making the most of everyday opportunities, even sharing a drink of water, can be turned into a spiritual conversation (John 4). These things can lead to spiritual talks and opportunities to share the gospel. He has shared quite enthusiastically that you do not have to hold a theological degree, "It's not complicated—just spend time with people."

Pastor Bryan is working in conjunction with the leadership of the Vermont churches to put together a discipleship training plan, something he can reproduce and make available to our churches; Ideally to personally present a 2-3 day seminar at your church— and then help the church to implement it. To stop the overall movement of trying just to bring people in, but rather taking the hope and power of the gospel out. And once the person is born again, bring him to church, encourage him to be baptized, and teach him all things. Some things at the church with the pastor, some things with the saints, some things one by one with the person(s) who led him to the Lord. It's a process that involves and blesses and rewards the church (the body) of the living God—It's an eternal investment in things above!!

INDIA – Submitted by Pastor Ike Graham

Persecution Relief reports that a teenage boy in Odisha was murdered and dismembered by Hindu activists in early June. This happened about 60 miles from Brother Nehemiah in Odisha. The men in Odisha have confirmed this report and Brother Nehemiah told me (Ike Graham) that he has been threatened similarly. Odisha has been one of the most persecuted places on earth, as far as Christian persecution, for years. It is not getting better. These men are the most serious, dedicated, bold Christians that I know. There are 3 major church planting locations in the state of Odisha; Golamunda, Umarkote and Semla.

GOLAMUNDA: There are 14 church planters who have started 16 churches and are working on 4 more. From February of 2019 to June 2020, they shared the Gospel 2,192 times and had 684 responses. "Responses" means that people either listened to the entire Gospel presentation and indicated that they wanted follow-up, or they called later and are still discussing the truth. Currently, there are 594 believers in the 16 churches. Of that number, 73 have come to Christ since February 2019.

SEMLA: There are 5 church planters who have started 5 churches. Since February of 2019 until now, they have seen 12 new believers added to the churches. This is their net gain because they lost 16 people.

UMARKOTE: There are 4 church planters and they have planted 4 churches. Since February 2019 until now, they have seen 24 new believers added to the churches. This is their net gain because they lost 15 people.

Since February of 2019 until the present, there has been a net gain of 189 Christians in all the churches. Of that number, 86 of them are new Christians. This brings the total number of believers in the CGBCIndia to 1,514. All the church planters continually express their gratitude to us for our prayers and financial support.

MYANMAR

The COVID-19 situation - The country of Myanmar has 234 confirmed cases as June 4, 2020. The government has imposed very strict rules and regulations to combat the virus. They have cut off all the transportation means such as buses, trains and even personal vehicles to curb the spread of the virus. As a result of these laws, many are without jobs and are having difficulty returning home. Strangely enough, one of the Burmese pastors, a Canadian citizen, has conducted a revival meeting at the beginning of the spread of the virus in our country. Now he is on trial and he was denied bail. If convicted, he will face jail time for his violation. On the other hand, the Buddhist extremists have used this as propaganda saying, "Christians are the ones who spread the virus". They are trying to create hatred toward Christians. Please pray for our country.

YANGON – We have been staying with our in-laws, and we are waiting for the time the government will reopen the transportation operations. Two weeks ago, out of desperation to go home, we tried to hire a car service, but the drivers are not willing to go down to Yangon, because when they return, they have to be quarantined for 21 days. Now, we are hoping we will be able to go home soon.

During our stay in Kanpetlet, we visited Mt. Victoria, one of the famous mountains in Chin State and enjoyed our time together. We also used our time for Bible study and writing a book in Burmese. Dee Htoo visited his parents Due to travel restrictions, he is not able to return to Yangon. Please pray for God's guidance for us.

KYAUK THU - Naing Ling and Hlui Mana are doing well. Due to the regulation that prohibited "more than five people gathering" they have had difficulty visiting homes. Last month they both went to their sending Church and Hlui Mana got married! They are planning to stay in Kyauk Thu. Please pray for their journey and for their service to the Lord. Thank you so much for bearing and standing with us. Your partnership is very much appreciated.
